## Where the pets eat the migrants!

Florida has created a novel new type of concentration camp where it can "temporarily" imprison people being held for future deportation to old-fashioned concentration camps in shithole countries that are better equipped to deal with "the vermin" Trump and his Trumpianites wish to dispose of.

They're calling it Alligator Alcatraz because in addition to armed guards and razor wire fences, prisoners will be deterred from trying to escape by the fear of being eaten alive by the live alligators stocked in the surrounding swamps.
